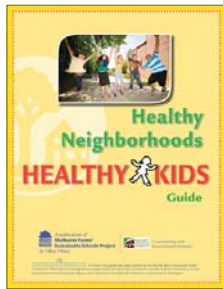

First newly revised guide from Shelburne Farms' Sustainable Schools Project reflects the changing field of

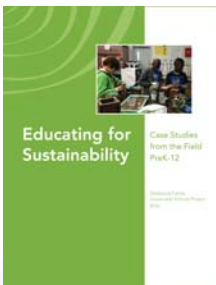
education for sustainability and shares the latest strategies. There's also the Education for Sustainability Starter Kit, a series of self-guided learning opportunities for schools.

It includes lesson plans, tools, planning guides, and resources.



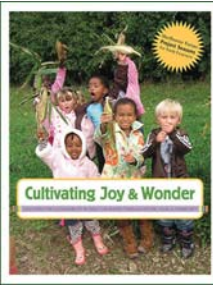

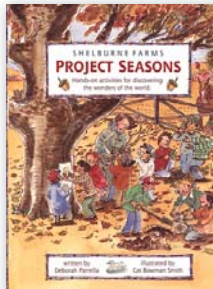

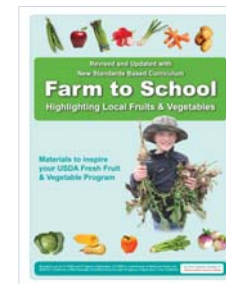
